


Do you know your dog's heartworm risk?

ccording to 2015 data from the Companion Animal Parasite Council, one in 78 dogs tested in the U.S. tested positive for heartworm disease. That was 115,016 dogs of 8,993885 tests. There's not a single state that's immune to heartworm risk, either.
